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

EDITORIAL JOSEP CARRERAS

Dear friends,

I am pleased to send you our annual activity report for 2023, which details the activity of Josep Carreras Leukaemia Foundation, created in 1988 with the aim of helping find a definitive cure for this disease.

The Foundation's efforts focus on four basic areas: scientific research, which is carried out at Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute; management of the Bone Marrow Donors Registry (REDMO) in Spain; the patient experience programme; and our welfare flats programme.

This report outlines the results of our activities, as well as key information relating to each area.

With respect to the **scientific research** carried out by Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute, I am proud to announce the following milestones achieved in 2023:

Firstly, we took the first steps towards overcoming treatment resistance in T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia, a rare disease that affects mainly children.

In parallel, researchers from Josep Carreras Institute developed the first model of childhood leukaemia using gene editing in a bid to gain a better understanding of a complicated form of leukaemia that has a poor prognosis and accounts for 80% of leukaemia cases in babies.

These two developments reflect our goal of making therapeutic solutions available to patients who need them in the shortest possible time.

A total of 23.686 new donors were added to the **Bone Marrow Donors Registry** (REDMO), which represented an 8% increase with respect to the previous year. At the end of the year, the total number of available donors was 484,175. In 2023, 396 Spaniards donated bone marrow to international patients, an increase of 24% compared to 2022. Meanwhile, 947 patients from all over the world received a bone marrow donation coordinated by REDMO. Since its creation in 1991, it has managed the collection, transport and infusion processes for 13,576 transplants.

On that subject, I would like to highlight the fact that we ended the year by passing an audit in December with the aim of obtaining official international certification from the World Marrow Donor Association (WMDA).

With respect to our **patient experience programme**, in 2022 we published the first Young People and Leukaemia study in Spain, in which more than 400 patients and former

patients participated. Our goal for 2023 was to gain more in-depth knowledge of certain aspects, so we launched a qualitative study at Hospital Clínic in Barcelona with a view to designing an initial model of care for young adults with acute leukaemia or aggressive lymphomas.

In addition, the Foundation's medical consultation service handled 617 inquiries from patients and family members and responded to 1,367 requests for information about diseases and transplants, social inquiries, etc., either by phone, social media or email.

With regard to our **welfare flats**, the Foundation acquired two new flats in 2023 to meet the high demand for free accommodation. In fact, in 2023 the Foundation accommodated 28 families, who spent a total of 1,495 nights in these flats.

Behind all these figures are individuals and families who are coping with a disease, and everything we do is for them and because of them.

Lastly, I would like to express my gratitude for the support provided by our members, companies and entities, those who decided to leave us an inheritance or a legacy and all those who organised events in aid of our Foundation.

This collaboration is key to allowing us to continue working with the same perseverance to achieve our vision: to ensure that leukaemia one day becomes a curable disease in each and every case. **Thanks for making us UNSTOPPABLE.**



Corporate governance

Legal compliance

Josep Carreras Foundation and the REDMO programme have the manuals, processes and resources required to demonstrate compliance with the laws and regulations that apply to us, including those relating to crime prevention and data protection.

All members of the organisation are responsible for strict compliance with the standards and have received training to keep them informed of these aspects. No complaints have been reported via the channel established for this purpose.



Quality control systems

We follow the requirements defined in a quality control system based on the ISO 9001:2015 standard, whose aim is to continuously improve our work and achieve an impact on results.

Key actions in 2023:

- All trustees undertook to observe the Code of Conduct for Trustees, in accordance with the recommendations of the Catalan Foundation Coordinator's Code of Good Governance.
- The resignation of trustee Dr. Jordi Sierra, which was based on personal grounds, became effective.
- All meetings of the governing bodies went ahead as planned: the Board of Trustees in June and the Delegate Committee in November, in addition to resolutions reached without meetings and the halfyearly meetings of the Regulatory Compliance Committee and the Operations Unit for the Prevention of Money Laundering.
- The content of the transparency section of the new website and the complaints channel was reviewed and developed.
- The Strategic Plan was reviewed.
- The trustee Lluís Bassat resigned.
- Dr. Quique Bassat joined the Board of Trustees.

In 2023, the following accreditations and documents remained in force:

- Framework agreement with the Ministry of Health for the management of REDMO.
- Agreement with the Andorran government and all autonomous communities.
- Authorisation granted by the Catalan government to REDMO as a tissue establishment in accordance with Spanish legislation.
- Authorisation granted by the Catalan government for the promotion of bone marrow donation in Catalonia.
- Passing of the onsite audit, the last stage in the process to receive certification for REDMO from the World Marrow Donor Association; we are waiting to receive the final report.
- Certification of the website by the Medical Association of Barcelona.
- Audit of the Data Protection Regulation, carried out by Faura-Casas.
- Audit of the Annual Accounts, carried out by the company Acordia ACR.
- · Review of the Crime Prevention Manual.
- · Review of the Security Document.
- Review of the Manual for the Prevention of Money Laundering.
- Inclusion of the Social Balance Sheet in the Activity Report.

In 2023:

- We reviewed and updated the documentation relating to the quality system: manuals, process map, procedures and protocols.
- We audited the quality system for REDMO processes.
- We analysed incidents and the process action plan.
- We conducted training and development relating to Power Bl.
- We developed the structure and indicators of the social balance sheet.
- We carried out continuous internal and external training for all staff.



The Friends of José Carreras International Leukaemia Foundation agreed to its dissolution and to use the funds to create a chair valued at more than one million dollars from the members of the clinical research division at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center (Hutch) in Seattle, for five-year tenure periods.

This chair was awarded to Dr. Geoffrey Hill in 2018 and then passed to Dr. Roland Walter after the tenure period ended in July 2023. Dr. Walter is a renowned haematologist who specialises in the treatment of acute myeloid leukaemia. The aim of his research is to develop new and improved antibody-based therapies to effectively kill leukaemia cells.

Bone Marrow Donors Registry (REDMO)

REDMO currently has access to the more than 40 million donors available across the world and, thanks to its work, nearly 13,576 transplants involving unrelated donors have been performed worldwide.

Patient experience

Programme to improve the patient experience in different areas. The programme includes both an online medical guidance service and a service to provide information and guidance on resources. Since 2010, more than **22,000 medical** inquiries and 22,000 information requests from patients or their families have been handled.

Welfare flats

The Foundation's "A Home From Home" programme offers accommodation in eight welfare flats that are located near the main bone marrow transplant centres in the Barcelona area and are adapted to the needs of patients and their families.

In 2023, 41 families stayed in our welfare flats, where they spent a total of 1,495 nights.











Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute, one of the Catalan government's CERCA research centres, was founded in 2010 by the Catalan government and Josep Carreras Leukaemia Foundation with the aim of boosting biomedical research and personalised medicine in the field of leukaemia and other malignant blood diseases.

It carries out excellent research on the basic, epidemiological, preventive, clinical and translational aspects of leukaemia and other haematological malignancies.

Its efforts are aimed at identifying new therapeutic targets and developing effective treatments with fewer side effects through cutting-edge research.

The Institute is unprecedented in that it brings together the efforts and rigour of world-class basic and clinical researchers. It employs the most innovative technologies, collaborates on many multicentre projects and competes successfully on both the national and the international stage. Its scientific output is already considerable and highly relevant. Its scientific articles have been published in the most prestigious international journals.



Josep Carreras Institute has five closely coordinated locations:

Can Ruti

This is located in Badalona, at the intersection between the academic world (Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona - UAB), pioneering research (Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute) and healthcare services (Hospital de Can Ruti).

Sant Pau

This centre is located in the health facilities of Hospital de la Santa Creu i Sant Pau and the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB).

Clínic

This is located within the scientific facilities of Hospital Clínic in Barcelona and the Universitat de Barcelona (UB).

Mar

This is set against a privileged biomedical backdrop in Barcelona, thanks to its proximity to Hospital del Mar and its position within a robust scientific ecosystem, i.e. Barcelona Biomedical Research Park (PRBB).

Josep Trueta

News in 2023



Genome studies gain importance in the diagnosis of the new generation of haematological cancers.

Researchers Eulàlia Genescà and Francesc Solé, from Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute, organised the third edition of the course "NEXT, New Generation Diagnosis in Leukaemia" in collaboration with the Spanish Society of Haematology and Haemotherapy (SEHH).

The course focused on the use of genome studies, which are gaining importance in the diagnosis and

treatment of haematological cancer. These studies make it possible to make more accurate diagnoses and select effective treatments.

Artificial intelligence is also being used to speed up the diagnosis process and improve the prognosis of these forms of cancer. It is important to highlight the importance of having reference centres for genome sequencing and specialists in the interpretation of results.



CarrerasLeaders, an initiative involving the collaboration of Josep Carreras Foundation, opened its second call for applications to find future leaders in haematological cancer research.

CarrerasLeaders is an innovative, global postdoctoral initiative promoted by Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute. This unprecedented programme seeks to promote research and innovation in the field of haematological cancer.


The aim of the project is **to fund 16 postdoctoral researchers of excellence over a period of three years**. Selected participants will join the Institute's research groups or scientific research platforms and will enjoy international research stays at both academic and non-academic institutions.

The CarrerasLeaders initiative is made possible thanks to the collaboration of Josep Carreras Leukaemia Foundation, support from the European Commission's COFUND programme Horizon Europe: Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions and the scientific coordination led by Dr. Marcus Buschbeck, head of the

Chromatin, Metabolism and Cell Fate group at Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute.

The programme's key points include: the scientific domain focused on haematological cancers; collaborative projects, ideally with international and intersectoral research stays (lasting between three and 11 months); and high-level scientific training through research and professional training in transferable skills.

This project was launched in March 2023 and, after five researchers were successfully selected, the second call was announced in November 2023.



Researchers at Josep Carreras Institute develop the first model of childhood leukaemia using gene editing.

Researchers from Josep Carreras Institute (including Dr. Clara Bueno and Dr. Pablo Menéndez's team) and the National Centre for Cancer Research (CNIO) (with Dr. Raúl Torres-Ruiz) developed a model of childhood leukaemia using gene editing.

This model mimics the disease in newborns and provides some insight into a complicated form of leukaemia called B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (B-ALL) with MLL::AF4 fusions, which has a poor prognosis and accounts for 80% of leukaemia cases in infants.

The researchers used CRISPR-Cas9 technology to edit genes in foetal and neonatal cells. MLL::AF4 fusions in childhood B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia are genetic changes that occur during foetal development and can lead to leukaemia. The model accurately reflects these gene fusions and what differentiates them.

Up until now, no reliable model has been available to study this disease in depth. This progress is key to gaining a better understanding of the disease and developing specific treatments to improve patient survival.



First steps to overcome treatment resistance in T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia.

Combining chemotherapy with betacatenin protein inhibitors in an animal model eliminates treatment resistance in T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia, a rare disease that affects mainly children.

This was demonstrated by a study led by **Dr. Anna Bigas**, head of the Stem Cells and Cancer group at Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute and Hospital del Mar Research Institute.

The researchers worked with patient samples and corroborated the results obtained with a mouse model. The study confirmed the decisive role played by beta-catenin in the formation of leukaemia due to its action on certain genes of the cells involved.

Dr. Bigas said, "This gene signature indicates which patients are more likely to fail to respond to chemotherapy. In light of this fact, and given that these genes are controlled by beta-catenin, our theory is that combining chemotherapy with inhibitors of this protein will lead to

a better response to chemotherapy in patients", before adding, "and we have demonstrated this in mouse models".

Results in animal models indicate that this combination makes those with refractory forms of the disease respond to treatment.

The researchers believe that it could also contribute to the successful treatment of leukaemia in patients who do respond to medication. Indeed, the study could pave the way to developing an indicator of a patient's response to treatment.

If their conclusions and the safety of the approach are confirmed, the possibility of conducting a clinical trial involving humans that combines chemotherapy and beta-catenin inhibitors will be assessed.

Researchers from Hospital Sant Joan de Déu in Barcelona also collaborated on this project.



New research teams in 2023



Cancer Metabolism research group **Dr. Lucas Pontel**

"The research conducted in our lab is focused on understanding and harnessing the unique characteristics of cancer, including leukaemia, that could be used as targets to stop the disease. We focus on the metabolic reprogramming of tumour cells, which is considered a defining feature of cancer. Tumour cells often alter their metabolism so that they can rapidly grow and proliferate. However, those same metabolic reactions also produce harmful toxins such as formaldehyde and reactive oxygen species, which can cause damage to cancer cells. Our research seeks to identify the mechanisms by which cancer cells protect themselves from these toxins and to exploit these mechanisms to develop new anticancer therapies."



Mechanisms of Cancer and Ageing research group **Dr. Salvador Macip**

"We study the mechanisms that determine treatment resistance and relapse in B-cell malignancies, especially chronic lymphocytic leukaemia (CLL) and diffuse large B-cell lymphoma (DLBCL), and the molecular pathways involved in age-related diseases, with a special focus on the role of cellular senescence in cancer and ageing-associated phenotypes. We also research prognostic/diagnostic markers of ageing and anti-senescence therapies for healthy ageing and as adjuvant treatments for leukaemia."

OneChain Immunotherapeutics



OneChain Immunotherapeutics receives €2.5 million from the European Commission to translate an innovative CAR-T therapy to clinical practice.

OneChain Immunotherapeutics is a spin-off founded by Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute with investments from Invivo Ventures, Nara Capital, Clave Mayor, CDTI-Innvierte (Ministry of Industry) and Josep Carreras Leukaemia Foundation.

In 2023, the company OneChain Immunotherapeutics received 2.5 million euros from the European Commission for the development of a new CAR-T therapy that does not require the patient's own cells and simultaneously attacks two cancer cell targets. The therapy could treat up to 80% of patients with T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (T-ALL), a subtype of leukaemia that affects mainly children, has few therapeutic options and accounts for 25% of all cases.

The three-year project aims to translate this therapy into clinical practice with the participation of Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute, Severo Ochoa Molecular Biology Centre (CBMSO, a joint research institute of CSIC and the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid) and the Portuguese company iBET.

In January 2023, recruitment for the first clinical trial by OneChain Immunotherapeutics began. The CARXALL trial will evaluate CAR-T CD1a (OC-1) therapy for the first time. This treatment specifically targets a subtype of T-cell leukaemia, cortical T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (coT-ALL), which accounts for 30% of T-ALLs and has

a poor prognosis in patients who do not respond to currently available treatments. The trial will be carried out at Hospital Clínic and Hospital Sant Joan de Déu in Barcelona, and is expected to include both paediatric patients and adults without any therapeutic alternatives. Although the patients will be treated in Barcelona, patients from across Europe as well as from Spain will be eligible to take part in the trial. In August 2023, the OC-1 product received **Orphan** Drug designation from the United States Food and **Drug Administration (FDA)** for the treatment of acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (ALL). This designation, which is granted to drugs and biological products intended to treat, diagnose or prevent diseases that affect fewer than 200,000 people in the United States, will provide the company with a number of **benefits** such as tax credits, exemption from certain regulatory fees, market exclusivity and guidance during clinical development.



Leukos Biotech







Luis Ruiz-Ávila / Interim CEO - Leukos Biotech

Leukos Biotech is a spin-off company of Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute dedicated to the development of new treatments and diagnostic tools for a wide range of haematological and solid tumours.

It was founded in 2015 and is currently developing a novel class of drugs around a **new therapeutic target** that attacks cancer stem cells and chemotherapy-resistant cells while preserving healthy cells.

In 2022, Leukos reached an agreement with AOP Health, an Austrian company that operates globally and is dedicated to the development and marketing of drugs for rare diseases. This agreement aims to allow AOP Health to harness its clinical expertise, financial resources and international distribution capacity to complete the research process and ensure that this new class of drugs is accessible to patients across the world.

Through this collaboration, the knowledge generated by Josep Carreras Leukaemia Research Institute and the molecules developed at Leukos will be translated into real clinical benefits for a broad range of unmet medical needs.

AOP is focusing on the treatment of acute myeloid leukaemia and myelodysplastic syndromes,

two oncohaematological diseases with limited therapeutic options, especially in cases of resistance to current treatments.

In 2023, AOP concluded the development of capsules for patients, which was the first step in ensuring future treatment for people affected by these oncohaematological diseases.

In 2022, Leukos obtained 1.5 million euros in state funding from the Ministry of Science, Innovation and Universities public-private partnership programme for the first clinical trial with this new class of molecule in collaboration with Vall d'Hebron Institute of Oncology (VHIO). This funding will help accelerate its entry into the clinic and make it possible to undertake an in-depth study to adjust the dose for haematological patients. **The clinical trial with this new class of drugs developed by Leukos is expect to be launched in 2024, based on research initiated at the Institute.**





What is REDMO?

Often, the only chance of a cure for many people with leukaemia and other malignant blood diseases is a bone marrow, peripheral blood or umbilical cord blood transplant (haematopoietic progenitors). However, three out of four patients will not have a compatible family member.


Therefore, Josep Carreras Foundation created the Bone Marrow Donors Registry (REDMO) in 1991, with the aim of enabling patients without a compatible family member to obtain bone marrow from an unrelated voluntary donor.

It became fully operational in 1994 when it was incorporated into the public health system with the signing of the first framework agreement between Josep Carreras Foundation and the

Ministry of Health, through the National Transplant Organisation.

REDMO is Spain's only official programme entrusted with managing the database of Spanish voluntary donors (data that is received directly from the autonomous communities), searching for compatible donors for Spanish patients and coordinating the transport of bone marrow, peripheral blood or umbilical cord blood from the donation site to the transplant centre.

REDMO also receives requests from foreign registries in other countries to search for Spanish donors who are compatible with foreign patients.



REDMO: a registry certified by the World Marrow Donor Association

In December 2023, REDMO passed an audit by the World Marrow Donor Association (WMDA), an entity that represents all marrow donor registries in the world and establishes the quality and safety standards that must be fulfilled.

The goal of the audit was to obtain WMDA certification, which would recognise REDMO as a donor registry that ensures that each and every stage of the process, from donor recruitment to follow-up after the progenitor cell donation process, always complies with every international standard and treats the donor with the utmost care to guarantee their safety and well-being.

In February 2019, REDMO passed the first stage, which was benchmarck certification. This was valid


for four years, so in 2023 it was required to pass the next and final step in the process, i.e. certification.

And in March 2024, we received the news that REDMO had achieved certification!




Global activity

Since it was created in 1991, REDMO has coordinated **13.576 transplants for patients all over the world.** We would like to thank the **6,301 Spanish** and **7,275 international donors** whose generosity has allowed us to give patients in need a second chance at life.





In 2023, we got even closer to the half million goal set by the National Bone Marrow Plan (PNMO), since we managed to reach a total of 484,175. It was the first time the yearly curve had changed from downward to upward since 2018.





* In 2012, successive National Bone Marrow Plans (PNMOs) were launched with the aim of increasing the number of bone marrow donors in Spain.

Pablo Ráez suffered from leukaemia and decided to launch a major social media campaign to raise awareness of bone marrow donation. His testimonial made it possible to dramatically increase the number of new donors. After the negative effects of the pandemic, we finally recovered our growth trend in this regard.




The quality of the information we share with transplant centres about the medical characteristics of donors is essential to minimise the time it takes to find a donor for a specific patient.





Right now, the probability that an active male donor will become an effective donor is 1 in 730. In the case of women, the figure is 1 in 1,960.

Compared to 2022, there was a 16% increase in men. Meanwhile, the probability of a woman being selected increased by 28%.

Requests about donors

Once a donor's full details have been added to REDMO, they are available to any patient in the world who requires them.

In the process of searching for an unrelated donor for a patient, it may be necessary to carry out extended donor typing (if not complete) or to request a sample to confirm the donor's typing profile, availability or physical condition.

In 2023, extended typing was handled in 1,170 cases, which represented a 12% increase in activity compared to the previous year.

In 2023, REDMO processed **2,032 donor verification** requests. These consisted of:



Completion of a medical and availability questionnaire:

1,934 medical questionnaires were completed in 2023.




Extraction of samples to confirm HLA typing at the transplant centre and analysis of basic infectious studies at the donor centre to prevent transmission to the patient (hepatitis, HIV, etc.).

samples were sent in 2023. This entire process, from request to sample extraction, was carried out in an average of 10 days, as established by WMDA standards and the National Bone Marrow Plan (PNMO).



Donations coordinated in 2023

In 2023, 396 Spaniards donated hematopoietic progenitor cells to international patients, an increase of 24% compared to 2022.







Umbilical cord blood units

The number of umbilical cord blood units available in the world is **805,525**. Spain has **62,097**, of which **230** were newly added in 2023. REDMO ranks first in Europe and second in the world in terms of the number of units available.

Evolution of the number of umbilical cord blood units available in Spain




In 2023, **81 units were sent for transplantation** to patients around the world.





Spanish hospitals requested that REDMO carry out a total of **1,260** searches for unrelated donors for Spanish patients, **12%** more than in 2022.




The average time taken to find a compatible donor was **28** days. A total of **93%** of these donors were found within two months of the start of the search.







Patient experience programme

Supporting patients and their relatives and ensuring that they have access to high-quality information are just some of our pillars. Diagnosis, the aftereffects of treatment, bone marrow transplantation, relapse, etc., are times when people are most in need of **medical or social guidance to help them clarify doubts and handle these situations better.**





Medical guidance consultations

Josep Carreras Foundation offers an **online medical guidance service 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.** Patients can access this channel via the website to ask clinical questions, which will be answered by members of the Foundation's medical management team, made up of haematologists with extensive experience, in less than 48 hours.

In 2023, the Foundation's medical consultation service responded to **617 requests for medical guidance** from patients and their families.



Information requests and guidance on resources

The information and resource guidance service responds to **information requests and inquiries about social matters.**

In 2023, this service handled 931 inquiries from patients and their families.

In 2023, we assisted **1,367 people** through the Foundation's guidance services.

Between 2010 and 2023, the patient experience programme handled more than **22,000 information requests and more than 22,000 medical guidance inquiries from patients and family members**.

To better support patients and their families and help them navigate the abundance of information, processes and resources, the patient experience programme publishes new manuals, videos, articles and documentaries relevant to them every year.

Young people and leukaemia: beyond survival


Every year between **4,000** and **5,000** adolescents and young adults **are diagnosed with aggressive blood cancer** (acute leukaemia and aggressive lymphomas).

Given the circumstances and the social and personal needs of these individuals, Josep Carreras Foundation set out to **learn more about all the non-medical aspects that affect them**. To achieve this, in 2022 we carried out Spain's **first study on young people and leukaemia**, in which more than 400 patients and former patients participated.

The goal for 2023 was to go one step further. To that end, a qualitative study was launched at Hospital Clínic in Barcelona, with the help of the Patient Experience Department and different members of the hospital's Haematology Service with a view to establishing an initial model of care for young adults with acute leukaemia or aggressive lymphomas. This study will be completed in 2024, and will also be tested in other hospitals to consolidate the model and the tools required to improve care for this group of patients.









The right to be forgotten regarding cancer

Some of the results regarding patients' access to financial products indicated in the Young People and Leukaemia report mentioned above are as follows:

A total of 47% of patients claimed to have encountered difficulties when trying to apply for a loan; 70% when applying for funeral insurance; and 83% when trying to take out life insurance.

Therefore, one of the key objectives of the patient experience programme in 2023 was to put these shortcomings on the media, political and social agenda.

Also in 2023, an informal working group was launched with Spain's leading cancer organisations on the right to be forgotten regarding cancer, especially in the field of finance, and on the reality of survivors' access to financial and insurance products.

On 29 June 2023, Spain adopted the regulation on the right to be forgotten regarding cancer*,

which was published in the Official State Bulletin (Royal Decree-Law 5/2023, provision 15135 of Official State Bulletin No. 154 of 2023, page 183), subject to immediate implementation.

*This law represents a breakthrough for many people who have overcome cancer, but crucial issues remain to be resolved and clarified. For this reason, the Foundation, individually or through the working group, holds meetings and liaises with a number of agents, companies and business associations in the sector at both national and European level.

Welfare flats programme: A home from home

The Foundation has **eight welfare flats**, in addition to a hotel accommodation programme, for blood cancer patients and their families who have limited financial resources.




All of the flats are single-family flats and are offered to patients at no cost. They are always granted based on an application from the hospital's social work department.

The Foundation's free accommodation is offered to patients who have to travel to the main referral hospitals in Barcelona: Hospital Clínic, Hospital de Sant Pau, Hospital Vall d'Hebron, ICO-Badalona / Germans Trias i Pujol, ICO-L'Hospitalet de Llobregat and Hospital Sant Joan de Déu.


Many people need to be in direct and frequent contact with a hospital after undergoing a transplant,

whether autologous or allogeneic, or CAR-T immunotherapy. This situation requires them to spend long periods near the transplant centre. This can become unaffordable for families, since they need to cover the cost of accommodation, meals and other expenses associated with staying away from home. Given the fact that numerous patients are referred to hospitals in Barcelona, many families come not only from Catalonia, but also from other autonomous communities or even abroad.

individual patients and their families stayed at the NH Sants and Sercotel Porta charitable hotels in Barcelona, with which the Foundation has a collaboration agreement, between 2012 to 2023 (275 stays for a total of 684 nights).



High demand and low supply: Two new flats

In 2023, data was collected to demonstrate **the** high demand for welfare flats for patients travelling away from home and the low supply of free accommodation: we were forced to turn down 40 requests due to a lack of availability. Therefore, due to the high price of hotels and apartments in Barcelona (hotels

cost an average of €186 per night, according to 2023 data) and the lack of charitable resources, the Foundation acquired two new welfare flats near Vall d'Hebron Hospital and ICO-L'Hospitalet. These will become available during the first quarter of 2024.

2023: Welfare flats

In 2023, five of the Foundation's welfare flats were specifically designed for blood cancer patients who had to undergo bone marrow transplants or CAR-T immunotherapy and who often have to stay in the flats for an extended period of time (at least 2-3 months).

Another of the Foundation's flats is designed for home transplants and is adapted for patients who have to recover from an autologous transplant (i.e. using cells from the patients themselves) for 15-20 days, during which they are offered daily care from a nurse at home.

Unstoppable hotels



Since 2012, the Foundation has had an agreement with **Hotel Sercotel Porta in Barcelona** (in Sant Just Desvern, a few minutes from Hospital Sant loan de Déu) for paediatric patients.





The Foundation also has an agreement with **NH Sants Hotel** in Barcelona for adult patients for stays of less than 15 days.

In addition, we also have an agreement with this hotel chain that allows us to host REDMO donors who have had to travel from their autonomous community. This project is part of the "Hotels with Heart" initiative within NH's CSR strategy.

After numerous tests, Marta was diagnosed with acquired bone marrow aplasia in June 2022. At first, we were stunned and we had so many questions.

After several unsuccessful rounds of treatment, we were referred to ICO-L'Hospitalet. The only solution was a bone marrow transplant.

The hospital's social work department offered us the option of staying in a flat, since we are from Terres de l'Ebre and couldn't travel back and forth every day.

The flat was so cosy and welcoming. It served as a base to let us rest and deal with some tough moments. Marta had complications, which meant our hospital stay was extended to 217 days in total. Marta also spent 40 days in the ICU, which, as you can

imagine, caused us a great deal of suffering.

But we never felt alone. The psychologists provided us with constant support, for which we were so grateful. Right now, Marta is recovering. Physically, she has to relearn how to walk and regain her strength.

We were lucky to have the flat and everything it meant to us. We want to thank everyone we've met throughout this difficult journey. Thanks to Josep Carreras Leukaemia Foundation, which guided us through our journey from the very start. Thank you to the doctors in the ICU and at ICO, the nurses for their huge commitment, the physiotherapists, the psychologists and, finally, to Carol, Esther and Jasmin."







Distribution by age (%)




Distribution by longevity (%)



Milestones in 2023



A network of flats that go the extra mile

We ended the year with half of our flats having been refurbished thanks to the collaboration of both large and small companies.

Some helped by financing the project and others by donating products.

All of them helped make our flats a home from home for patients and their families.

We renewed the agreement to provide families in highly vulnerable situations with food vouchers (Consum Cooperativa).

We also put welcome kits in the welfare flats thanks to the generosity of the **La Caixa Foundation**. We even have agreements with two hotel chains so that patients who have to travel away from home can stay as outpatients (**NH** and **Sercotel**).



Committed to improving the patient experience

Thanks to collaborations with different companies, we carried out awareness projects, including financing for an almost complete collection of video podcasts and free loan of all spaces required for filming, sponsorship of several manuals (including manuals about work-related issues with Baker McKenzie Lawyers, caregivers and patients of multiple myeloma with Pfizer, dry eyes with the Barraquer **Foundation**; a pain guide with the Grünenthal Foundation; and a manual on physiotherapy with Sanofi).

We produced two videos: one on myelodysplastic syndromes (MDS) and the other on bone pain (Asisa Foundation).



We had powerful speakers for our campaigns

- Our advert was shown on every available screen at **DIR** sports centres.
- We launched a comprehensive campaign in all of Transports Metropolitans de Barcelona's physical and digital facilities (TMB Foundation).



Committed to scientific research

Thanks to targeted donations, we channelled almost €200,000 for specific research lines by Josep Carreras Research Institute, thus respecting the will of our donors.

Some companies form part of the network of donations for specific REDMO projects and finance travel between autonomous communities (Moventia) or offer accommodation to donors when they have to leave their homes for the actual donation process (NH Hotels). However, they also allow us to continue making headway in the development of technological tools to improve the effectiveness of the project.

In addition, we worked together on an educational project that introduced new donors to the registry (**Fundació per la Creativació**).



Hand in hand with local trade

We launched an advert designed to raise awareness among traders with the aim of reaching new audiences and increasing our visibility on the street.

In addition, we provided the traders involved in the programme with a loyalty kit and carried out activities in three other markets in the city of Barcelona during our Leukaemia Awareness Week.

More than 300 shops and six commercial hubs form part of Unstoppable Traders.



Alliances through calls for aid

The launch of our TikTok channel was made possible thanks to a grant from the **Santander Foundation**, many of whose employees rounded down their salaries in aid of our projects. The **Accenture Foundation** and the **Mahou San Miguel Foundation** also collaborated.

In addition, we professionalised our projects and improved the application for our calls.







Leukaemia Awareness Week

As every year, the Foundation redoubled its efforts during Leukaemia Awareness Week to highlight research on leukaemia and other malignant blood diseases. We increased our presence from 19 June to 23 July, not only in our regular communication

channels, but also in the national media. We also carried out different initiatives throughout Spain to raise awareness of our mission.

Unstoppable Day 2023

On Sunday 18 June, we celebrated the 12th edition of Unstoppable Day, a crucial day for the Foundation, since it celebrates LIFE and RESEARCH accompanied by the Unstoppables and their families.



"The best news ever" campaign

In 2023, we resumed one of our most poignant awareness campaigns: "The best news ever".

The cornerstone of the campaign is an emotive and intimate advert that offers an insight into parents' emotions when they receive the best news ever: that their child has beaten leukaemia.

In addition to frequent slots on the main national TV channels, which attracted more than **18 million views**, the image for the campaign was projected across Spain in the transport systems of Barcelona, Madrid, Bilbao, Seville, Valencia, Zaragoza, La Coruña, San Sebastián, Vigo and Córdoba.

We also featured on the front pages of national and regional newspapers (1,671,509 people saw us) and on radio shows throughout Spain (3,261,082 people heard us).

In addition, we benefited from the valuable collaboration of entities such as Renfe (27 high-speed and long-distance trains), 20 DIR gyms in Barcelona and Sant Cugat del Vallès, Moventia (two buses) and TMB Foundation, which all enthusiastically joined us in disseminating this striking campaign.

"Match Tour. A tour for love, love for life"

A new national campaign called "Match Tour. A tour for love, love for life" was launched in Barcelona on 15 September by Josep Carreras Foundation in collaboration with the National Transplant Organisation and all autonomous communities.

The primary goal was to encourage people aged 18 to 40 to sign up to the Bone Marrow Donors Registry (REDMO), which is managed by the Foundation.

Since 2018, the number of new donors has fallen dramatically and we did not reach the goal of half a million donors set for 2022.

Therefore, we decided to launch this campaign as an extra step towards reversing this situation. And we did it!

We embarked on this exciting journey. For 45 days, a bus travelled through **17 cities in Spain and Andorra** and promoted bone marrow donation wherever it went.

The campaign had incredible results. Hundreds of young people expressed their interest and many became donors in the hope of someday making the most important match of their lives. We managed to reverse the trend at REDMO and now it is moving in a **positive** direction.


